THE CASCADES CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP

In the early 2000's we led a collaborative raising \$84 million to protect over 60 square miles of forestland, enhancing a wildlife corridor between the Alpine Lakes and Mount Rainier and laying the foundation for our Central Cascades restoration work.



I-90 WILDLIFE CROSSINGS

Led efforts to establish dozens of wildlife crossings on I-90 successfully reconnecting the North and South Cascades.



MOUNT BAKER-SNOQUALMIE NATIONAL FOREST

Snoquera Project: Working with the U.S. Forest Service to improve habitat and restore watershed health of Upper White and Green Rivers.

Key species: Chinook salmon, fishers, Roosevelt elk



OKANOGAN-WENATCHEE NATIONAL FOREST

Mount Hull: Partnering with the Forest Service to restore 20,000 acres of pine forest to historic conditions while protecting a major wildlife corridor in north-central Washington.

Key species: bighorn sheep, northern goshawk



COLVILLE NATIONAL FOREST

Collaborating with the NE Washington Forest Coalition to promote sustainable forestry practices and create new wilderness areas in Washington's least-protected national forest.

Key species: wolves, moose, Canada lynx



GOLD CREEK

Working with a broad coalition to restore Gold Creek Valley to its natural wetland state, bringing back native aquatic species.

Key species: bull trout, steelhead
