## LOOKING AHEAD TO 2021

- Fighting for greater accountability and regulation of B.C. mining to protect transboundary rivers like the Skagit, Columbia and Similkameen
- Lobbying for infrastructure spending bill that could bring millions to WA for wildlife crossings and habitat restoration
- Advocating for state lands to be managed for “all the people,” not just fiduciary trusts



## WATCHDOG & PARTNER FOR WILD FORESTS & WATERSHEDS

- Monitoring the US Forest Service to ensure timber sale revenue continues to fund watershed and forest restoration in 100,000 acre Little Naches area
- In the Snoquera area north of Mt. Rainier, partnering with Forest Service to remove culverts, decommission roads, and repair damage from dispersed campsites to improve watershed health
- Advocating for policies that protect vulnerable ecosystems from destructive wildfires on state and federal lands
